NEW BRUNSWICK, N J. Feb. 19 – Robert Wood Johnson planned to build a cancer institute on New Brunswick school district property.

The 12-story, 96-bed hospital would hire 10 new research teams and is expected to create 1,500 jobs.

RWJBarnabas agreed to use part of their \$750 million budget to build a new building for the Lincoln Annex School.

Many parents have been against the Rutgers Cancer Pavilion and has argued that a new school should be built before construction begins.

Maria Chiquito, mother of a 5<sup>th</sup> grader at Lincoln Annex, said that she's upset because the community loves their school and that kids shouldn't have to be moved to a warehouse to study.

Mayor Jim Cahill has said that this site is the most optimal for the hospital and that regardless of the board's decision, the cancer hospital will still be built to some extent.
